
## Chabot College First-Generation College Students by Race-Ethnicity: Fall 2021

In the California Community College Student Success Metrics Dashboard, first-generation status is defined as a student for whom no parent or guardian has earned more than a high school diploma and who has no college experience. By this definition, 44% (Fall 2021) of Chabot students were considered first-generation. First-generation is also commonly defined in federal grants and reports as a student for whom no parent or guardian has earned a bachelor's degree; thus, students who have at least one parent/guardian with some college experience or even an associate's degree would still be considered first-generation. By this definition, 71% (Fall 2021) of Chabot students were considered first-generation. Further, first-generation status varies by students' racial and ethnic backgrounds. Defining first-generation as neither parent/guardian having a bachelor's degree, in Fall 2021, Latino/a/x (86%), Pacific Islander (83%) and Native American/Alaska Native (89%) students are most likely to be first-generation, whereas White (59%) and Filipino/a/x students (46%) are least likely to be first generation. Regardless of how first-generation is defined, it is clear that Chabot needs to ensure we have strong programs and services in place to support our first-generation students.
