Chabot College Student Characteristics: Fall 2016 Part-time Students compared to Full-time students

Out of 14,117 Chabot students in Fall 2016, 68% attended part-time: 38% took 6-11 units and 30% took less than 6 units. Part-time students taking 6-11 units were somewhat similar to full-time students. Their main differences were that they were somewhat more likely to be Latino, have a BA/BS or higher degree, take an online class, and have an educational goal of job training. They were also less likely to have a goal of transferring.

However, part-time students taking less than 6 units were quite a bit different from the full-time students and the part-time students taking more units. These students were *much more likely* to be white, older, transferring from another college, have a BA/BS or higher degree, attend in the evening or Saturday, take an online class, and have a job training goal.
