

Chabot College Student Characteristics Fall 2015 Veterans vs. Non-Veterans

In Fall 2015, 366 veterans attended Chabot, making up three percent of the student body. The typical veteran at Chabot was a 30 year-old White or Latino man, older than most Chabot students. Like all Chabot students, most veterans were continuing students; half with less than 30 units earned. About 40 percent were full-time; half attended only during the day. Over half intended to transfer to a four-year college, while seventeen percent of vets were here for an occupational certificate or training.

Veterans earned two percent of degrees in 2015-2016 which is less than their representation on campus. However, they earned four percent of certificates, which is more than their representation on campus.
