## Chabot College Student Characteristics Fall 2016 Veterans vs. Non-Veterans

In Fall 2016, 405 veterans attended Chabot, making up three percent of the student body. The typical veteran at Chabot was a 25-29 year-old White or Latino man, older than most Chabot students. Like all Chabot students, most veterans were continuing students; half with less than 30 units earned. About forty-one percent were full-time; forty-one percent attended only during the day. Over half intended to transfer to a four-year college, while eighteen percent of vets were here for an occupational certificate or training.

Veterans earned three percent of degrees in 2016-2017 which is equal to their representation on campus. However, they earned five percent of certificates, which is more than their representation on campus.
