

  - Low-income students of any race or ethnicity with a transfer/degree educational goal


# Percentage of Latinx Students at Chabot Increased Over Past Nine Falls: Is it leveling off?

#### Percentage of Low-Income\* Students on Campus





<sup>\*</sup>Low-Income students include students who received a Pell and/or CAL Promise Grant

# Percentage of Low-Income Students at Chabot has Decreased: But has it really?


- A 9% decrease in the past five falls seems significant, but we are unsure how to interpret.
- We use Pell and Promise Grant receipt as a proxy for low-income
  - High cost of living area, problematic
- We have increased the percentage of Latinx students on campus. Are Latinx students equally likely to apply for financial aid?
  - Potential Barrier: Documentation status
- Further research is needed to interpret this statistic.

### Percentage of HSI Students at Chabot






### Course Success Rates by Race/Ethnicity




#### AB 705

- Legislation ensuring that all students have access to transfer level English and Math and *cannot be required* to take remedial/basic skills course work
- Took effect in Fall 2019
- Impacts at Chabot so far...
  - Huge increases in transfer-level English and Math enrollments
  - Increases in one-term throughput for both English and Math
  - It's too early to say impact on course success rates conclusively, but...
    - Safe to say that course success rates did not improve
  - But what about course success rates by race and ethnicity?

## Course Success Rates in Transfer English for Latinx Students Tend to be Lower than Asian-American, Filipino, and White Students




### Course Success Rates in Transfer Math for Latinx Students Tend to be Lower than Asian-American, Filipino, and White Students


