*Aspirational Institution-set Standards:*

Chabot's institution-set standards are aspirational goals chosen in relation to Chabot's peer colleges.

*Peer Colleges:*

Chabot's peer colleges are the California Community Colleges that best match Chabot's student demographics and local educational indicators.

Peer colleges at the time of this report were: Contra Costa, Cosumnes River, Evergreen Valley, Mt San Antonio, Sacramento City, San Diego City, Skyline, and Solano.

*Setting aspirational goals:*

These decision rules for setting aspirational goals were approved by PRBC on March 16, 2016:

If Chabot is below average among peer group colleges, goal is to be at the average.

If Chabot is at the average among peer group colleges, goal is to be in top third.

*Unduplicated:* Each student is counted only once for their first degree and/or first certificate.

*\*Gainful Employment Certificates* are certificates eligible for Financial Aid
