
Chabot College Degree and Certificate Graduates Completion Time and Attendance Patterns 2000 to 2013

Summary

Most Chabot graduates attend every term and more than half attend full-time every term. The percentage of graduates who finish in two years or less has increased from 23 percent in 2000 to 31 percent in 2013. The percentage of graduates who finish in 3 years or less has averaged 57 percent in the last 13 years and those who finish in 4 years or less has averaged 76 percent.

The Graduate Survey is given every other year to degree and certificate graduates who attend the Spring graduation ceremony. About one third of the graduates attend, and two thirds of those attending fill out a survey. So the survey results are more representative of those attending graduation than of all graduates. However, it does give us a glimpse of the attendance patterns of these successful graduates.
