Background on ACCJC Definitions and Goal Setting at Chabot

ACCJC GOAL Setting





- ★ Institution-Set Standards: a minimum baseline value we should not drop below, the "floor"
- ★ Stretch Goals: a goal above our current level of performance that we aspire to achieve

- 2. Number of Certificates Awarded
- 3. Number of Associate Degrees Awarded
- 4. Transfers

How do we goal set at Chabot?

- Standard Deviation Method of Goal Setting
 - Use the most recent five years of data on an indicator/metric (e.g., Number of Degrees Awarded)
 - Calculate a standard deviation of the metric to see how much the metric varies, on average
 - Use for metrics with reasonable sample sizes



STANDARD DEVIATION METHOD OF GOAL SETTING.

To develop accreditation "Institution-Set Standards" (floor)

- Multiply the standard deviation by 1.96 and subtract it from the most recent measurement.
- □ Why?
 - 95% of values fall 1.96 standard deviations above and below the mean
 - It would be statistically very unlikely to fall below this number by chance.
 - □ Therefore, if we fall below, we can reasonably assume that we have done something differently that did not work (or a world pandemic happened).



STANDARD DEVIATION METHOD OF GOAL SETTING.

To develop accreditation "Stretch Goals"

- Add one standard deviation to most recent measurement
- Why?
 - 68% of values fall one standard deviation above and below the mean
 - If we land above this value, we could reasonably attribute it to something we had done (as opposed to chance), but it is statistically likely to reach every so often.
- Watch indicator/metric year over year to see if we stay at this new higher level

Employment Rates for Career and Technical Ed Students

- The Institution-Set Standard for all CTE programs follows the goals set by Perkins (which ranged from 72-74% in 17-18 and 18-19).



 - Indicators #5 and #6: Stretch goals not required




Goal Setting for 2020-21



- PRAC is the shared governance body to approve our institution set standards and stretch goals for ACCJC reporting.
 - ACCJC Annual Report is due April 9, 2021. We must have these targets to submit this report.
 - Suggested Motion:
 - Approve 20-21 targets for indicators #1-3, as outlined in presentation,
 - Recommend OIR use the agreed upon standard deviation method to set the targets for transfers (indicator #4) once data is available
 - Reach out to Dean of H, K & A to set targets for indicator #5
 - Reach out relevant Deans to set targets for indicator #6
 - Alternative Motion: Ask OIR to come back at the March 17th PRAC meeting, once transfer data is available, so that all targets for metrics #1-#6 can be presented and approved.
