
## White-European Students at Chabot College: Success and Persistence

These tables show the latest course success and persistence rates of White students at Chabot by gender, age, student type, and educational goal. White students have higher success rates and similar persistence rates compared to all Chabot students. Among White students, success rates are the highest among students 30-39 years, continuing students, and those with job training goals. Persistence rates are highest among women and men 19 years or younger, continuing students 19 or younger, and new students with transfer goals.
