Chabot College Summer Enrollments: 2014, 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018 Summer Success Rates: 2017 and 2018

The surge in summer enrollments that started in Summer 15 was sustained in Summers 16-18. Like Summers 15-17, Summer 18 offered two 5-week sessions, as well as 6-, 8-, 9- and 10-week sessions, with largest enrollments in the 8-week session. Just over half of the students enrolled in on-campus sections; the rest took online or hybrid sections.

Overall success rates rose in Summer 18 from 77 to 79 percent, largely due to increases in success in the 8-week session. The greatest increase in success rates by course meeting location occurred in face-to-face classes (from 79% in Summer 17 to 81% in Summer 18).




