The **ASPIRE** Student Support Services Program

The ASPIRE program at Chabot College offers eligible students in-depth academic support. Through individualized academic, financial and personal counseling, coupled with career exploration and cultural enrichment



activities, the program aims to ensure student success at Chabot and beyond.

As a federally funded TRIO

program, ASPIRE participation is limited to students who meet these specific eligibility requirements:

- First Generation College Student
- Low-Income Student or
- Disabled Student

In order to join the ASPIRE program, individuals must first meet with the program coordinator to determine eligibility and complete an application.



Academic & Personal Counseling

ASPIRE utilizes a holistic approach to “academic advising” that focuses on the “whole student” and the various issues that impact academic performance. Counselors help students think critically about their academic and personal lives and assists them in identifying resources and support services to help them navigate the educational system and meet their goals.

Through individualized counseling sessions students discuss academic progress, major requirements, transfer requirements and inter-personal issues. Each student will develop a Student Educational Plan (SEP) that lists recommended courses and is revised and updated every semester. The SEP will also help with course selection during pre-registration.

Academic Support Services

The ASPIRE program offers multi-tiered academic support services. Through detailed assessment each student will develop their SEP and be encouraged to enroll in clustered courses that offer additional academic support. Students will be eligible for tutoring and study groups and will take College Success courses to develop their academic survival skills.



During individual advising sessions, Counselors discuss majors of

interest, college and university identification, the application process, and financial aid and scholarship assistance. Students will also have opportunities to visit local four year colleges and universities and speak to representatives from various campuses.

Career Exploration

Career development is an important key to helping each student identify their educational goals. Through the College Success classes and individual counseling, students will explore different careers based on their values and interests.
