## Chabot College Faculty/Staff Accreditation Survey: Spring 2014 Highlights

## Standard IV: Leadership and Governance: Board and Administrative Organization

Staff tend to be only moderately satisfied with the Chabot-Las Positas Board of Trustees and the District Administration. However, there has been an improvement in satisfaction with Chabot College's Administration since the last faculty/staff survey in 2008. The Faculty/Staff Accreditation Survey was sent to all Chabot staff in March 2014. There were 371 responses for an overall response rate of 64%, with 94% of part-time classified professionals, 83% of full-time classified professionals, 46% of part-time faculty, 76% of full-time faculty, and 86% of administrators represented.
