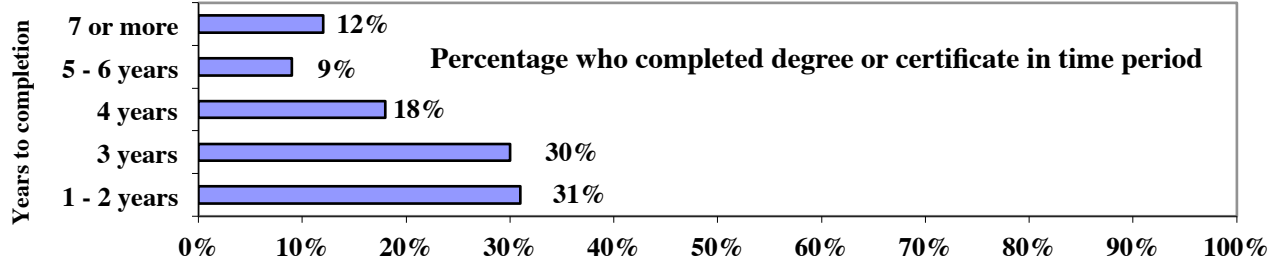

Survey of Spring 2013 Degree and Certificate Graduates

Sixty percent of 2012-13 degree and certificate graduates completed their programs within three years; one third finished in 1-2 years, according to the Spring 2013 Graduation Survey. Thirty-nine percent took four or more years. The majority persevered to graduation by attending every term and attending mostly full-time, whether or not they were working. Almost half of the graduates planned to transfer to a four-year college.

The survey was given to 2012-13 degree and certificate graduates who attended the graduation ceremony in May 2013. It was filled out by 60 percent of the 318 graduates attending that day, or 23 percent of all 834 2012-13 graduates. It provides a glimpse of the completion patterns and future plans of the graduates.
