Do you know what you want to be when you grow up? If you're like most kids, you have no idea. Well, we're going to give you a chance to explore many different careers and give you hands-on experience that may help get you closer to a decision—and also see what Chabot College has to offer. In this camp, taught primarily by Chabot faculty members, we've chosen your classes for you so you can get a full-range of experiences to open the window to the world of careers ahead! You will bring home your projects, souvenirs, lots of career handouts, and a Certificate of Completion when you "graduate" on Friday. This first-time program is limited to only 25 students. Science & Engineering (9-11:30 a.m.)

Learn how varied the field of sciences can be and how many careers you can explore. During this week you will learn about astronomy, physics, chemistry, biology, forensics, biotech, microbiology, and engineering—all in creative ways. Your instructors will make it fun and fascinating as you do hands-on experiments in everything from collecting your own DNA, making GAK, and analyzing crime-scene fingerprints to building rockets, experimenting with lasers, and getting firsthand knowledge from Lawrence Livermore Lab and Stanford University guest speakers. Health & Emergency Services (12:45-2:15 p.m.)

Find out about exciting and growing careers in the health care field while experiencing firsthand some of the responsibilities. You'll practice CPR and check vital signs on a breathing mannequin and practice using a stethoscope and an oximeter. You'll learn what athletic trainers do for injured athletes and practice taping and icing each other. Then you'll learn about the life of an Emergency Medical Technician, find out the best way to respond to an emergency, and climb inside a real ambulance. Work alongside Chabot's chief firefighting instructor and veteran firefighter as he demonstrates the challenges of his job. Media & Technology (2:30-4 p.m.)

Have you ever wanted to be on camera or hear your voice on the radio? Do you love to write and are looking for a way to make headlines? Do you like to draw and want to watch your characters come to life online? In this camp, you'll get it all!
