SCHOLARSHIPS & AWARDS PROCEDURES FOR APPLICATION

DEADLINE: Thursday, March 1, 2012 at Noon in Room 2355

Applications and nominations received after this deadline will be disqualified.

PROCEDURES:

1. Review the list of awards and scholarships located in this packet. Determine your eligibility based on each award description. Applicants may apply for more than one award or scholarship.
2. Complete and submit an application (copies are accepted) along with 2 letters of reference by the deadline. Incomplete or late packets will be disqualified.
3. Applicants must have completed a minimum of 6 semester units (as of Fall 2011) at Chabot College and be currently enrolled in a minimum of 6 units (as of Spring 2012). (Check minimum units requirement for each scholarship).
4. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 or better. (Please check GPA eligibility for each scholarship.)
5. If you are planning to transfer to a four-year college, you need to submit a copy of their letter of acceptance by **Thursday, May 3, 2012 by Noon**, to the Office of Student Life. **All transfers must occur by Fall 2012!**
6. Applicants must authorize the Director of Student Life to request student transcripts from Admission & Records by checking the appropriate box on the application.
7. Each award has an attached nomination form that must be completed.
8. Each scholarship has a set of questions applicants must answer in essay format. All essays must:
 - Be authentic (no plagiarism).
 - Be typewritten, double-spaced, 12-point font. Handwritten essays will disqualify the application.
 - Must be one or two pages in length only.
 - Have your W# on each page. AVOID putting your name on the essay.
9. All completed applications must be submitted by **Thursday, March 1, 2012 at 12:00 P.M., to the Office of Student Life, Room 2355.**
10. Winners will receive their scholarships and/or awards at the Chabot Scholarships and Awards Reception to be held on **Friday, May 11, 2012** at 6 PM in the Crown Plaza Hotel. Winners will receive a complimentary dinner for themselves and 2 complimentary dinner tickets for guests. Any additional guest tickets may be purchased for a cost of \$40 per guest. RSVP deadline for the banquet is REQUIRED and the deadline is April 25, 2012. Absolutely no RSVPs shall be accepted after April 25, 2012.

12. I certify that any funds received will be used solely for educational purposes and expenses, including books and supplies.
13. If I am awarded an OSHER scholarship, I agree to send a thank you letter to the Osher Foundation and a copy of my letter to the Financial Aid Office.
14. I understand that I may lose my award if I fail to meet the eligibility criteria during the disbursement period.
15. I understand that if I do not meet the eligibility criteria during the scholarship review process, I will not be considered for this scholarship.
16. Any holds placed on an applicant's record for payment owed to Chabot College must be resolved before student can receive a monetary scholarship or the award or the scholarship amount will be applied towards repayment of the debt.
