- 1) All Chabot students must have an **SEP** (Student Educational Plan) on file with Admissions and Records by the time they have 30 attempted units at Chabot-LPC to be considered for financial aid. **Students are required to make an appointment with an Academic Counselor to complete an SEP** well before the start of the semester as Counselor schedules fill up quickly. **If you have prior academic units that you intend to apply to your degree objective at Chabot, you must have official transcripts on file with the Chabot Admissions & Records Office so they can be included in your SEP.** **New students should attend a New Student Orientation through Counseling, only available through the beginning of each term.** (See class schedule for dates and times.)
- 2) **No financial aid disbursement** will occur until SEP and prior academic transcript requirements are met.
- 3) The **PRIORITY DATE** for FWS (Federal Work-Study), FSEOG (Federal Supplemental Opportunity Grant), and initial CAL GRANT consideration **deadline** is **MARCH 2nd** each year.
- 4) The competitive **CAL GRANT** program allows for a **September 2** application deadline if you will attend a California Community College (*pending state budget approval*). We **strongly** recommend you apply by the **March 2nd** deadline each year to be considered for the maximum types and amounts of financial aid. You then have two chances to be awarded for the limited Cal Grant fund (March 2nd & September 2nd). Both a FAFSA and a GPA Verification form must be provided by the deadline for consideration.
