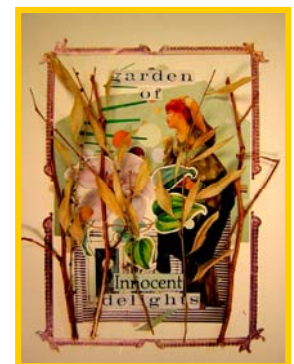
### Assemblages by Janice Golojuch - Ladies in Waiting

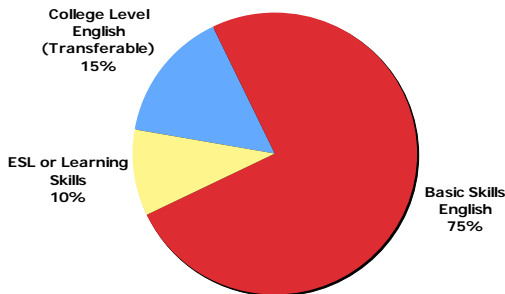

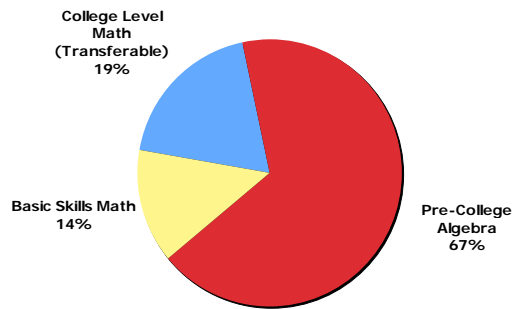

## CONSTRUCTION UPDATE



**Athletic Fields are Complete:** The Athletic Fields renovation project is now complete with the exception of a few punch list items. The various projects include a new synthetic turf football field, new softball field, new tennis courts and several support buildings including a concession stand, toilet building, and several storage buildings. Come see the new look.

**Instructional Office Building:** The Instructional Office Building continues to rise. The sec-

ond floor walls and columns are now complete and the formwork for the concrete roof has begun. The project is on schedule to be occupied this August.

**Community and Student Services Center:** The CSSC has topped out with the steel erection and all concrete tilt-up panels have been cast. The project is on schedule to be occupied next January.

**Campus Security:** The campus security project is now substantially complete and the implementation of new access protocols will begin this month. Training of campus employees will begin this month as the various buildings are brought online.

**Building 500 Has Started:** Furniture, equipment and belongings have been moved out of Building 500 in preparation for construction. The first step will be Hazmat remediation and then renovation will begin.

**Central Utility Plant is Operational:** The Central Utility Plant is now finished and operational. Start-up procedures are underway. The pumps, boilers, chillers and cooling towers are all operational and are being commissioned. The trenches are filled and paving is being completed. The next step will be to connect the campus buildings into the system.
