College Council recently passed a resolution to delete the on-campus smoking provisions of the College's smoking policy. On behalf of the Health and Safety Committee, starting in Fall 2009, there will no longer be any smoking allowed on campus, and smoking will be limited to the college's parking lots only. There are a number of Colleges that have adopted this policy with Las Positas College having recently done so.

The implementation schedule will be that the smoking signage will be taken down over the summer and new signage directing people not to smoke in the campus' interior will be visible. In conjunction with this, the Chabot College Student Health Center will be providing literature regarding the health hazards of smoking. Informational literature regarding smoking cessation and a Quit Kit is also available at no cost at the Student

Health Center located in Room 120 in Building 100. The Health Center is in the process of hiring a wellness coordinator to assist Center staff with creating a smoking cessation program on campus. In the interim, for those who would like information regarding smoking cessation programs and community referrals, please contact the Health Center.



The campus will notify students about the recent change in the smoking policy on campus by mailing information to all students who purchase parking permits and Emails will be sent, in addition to posting signs around campus. The enforcement of this new rule will begin this Fall, and it will be enforced equally among faculty, staff and students.

Recently, an announcement was made to the Board of Trustees of CLPCCD that Chabot College will be identified as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI), thus making us eligible for federal grants. In order to maintain and increase the 25% Latino enrollment at Chabot College, the HSI subcommittee will continue to bring forth various outreach and retention efforts on campus. With this in mind, one of our first outreach efforts taking place this upcoming year will be a parent and student talk show hosted by Student Services staff.

The purpose of this talk show is to provide an intervention dialogue between parents, first-time college students, and Chabot

staff about the students goals and how the parents and staff can help support those goals. The level of involvement for language-minority parents have minimal experience and no familiarity with the Community College system and for some students this event may be an influencing factor to helping students achieve their goals. The event will take place Saturday, August 8th, 9 a.m. to noon, and Wednesday, August 12th, 6 to 9 p.m. in Room 1232 (Choir Room). CONSTRUCTION UPDATE

Chabot College is Producing Clean Power: Chabot has finished installing all 100,000 square feet of solar photovoltaic panels. For the first time in our history we are generating one megawatt of clean, renewable electricity and feeding it into our campus grid. All solar arrays are up and running. We are now producing about 20% of our annual electrical needs by Solar Photovoltaic Panels.

Central Utility Plant Hook-Ups: Chabot began the connection of three more buildings to our Central Utility Plant. Buildings 300, 2100, and 3900 were identified as priority projects because of the age and failing condition of their existing mechanical units. These buildings should be operating off our new Central Utility Plant by mid-June.

Campus Drive has Started: Construction crews broke ground June 1st to connect our two largest parking lots with an interior road. This will allow students to drive from one lot to the other without using Hesperian Boulevard. The new Campus Drive will provide a new bus stop for the drop off and pick up of campus students and staff.

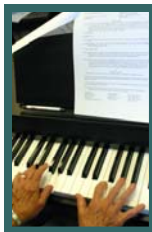


They can also learn to play the guitar; improve their skills in softball, track, volleyball, and soccer; review their algebra, and prepare for the Fall SAT.



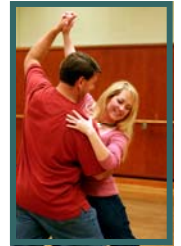
