Presentations 3.1 HKA Programs Data Presentation</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • HKA Programs Data Presentation <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Julie Coan started the presentation by presenting on Dental Hygiene and giving the job description of dental hygienists - She mentions that their program is a two-year program and gave a bit more information on entry into the program as well as degrees offered - Julie then mentioned some goals for the program include offering baccalaureate degrees - Julie then went through some of the data points found on the program, including the number of students in the program and a labor market report - She then walked through their Accreditation process and that they are accredited through the Committee on Dental Accreditation - Julie then finished her presentation by going through many of the equipment and items bought with Strong Workforce and how they have helped expand the program - Kristina Perkins then began to present on the EMS program (presentation provided by Sara Beyne) - Kristina presented on the number of students in the program and showed that the program is on a rise since post Covid, as well as some of their non-traditional students and special population students - She then touched on students that exit the program with a job closely related to their field of study, and that most students pass their national exam and start working within 1-3 months of graduation - Kristina then finished the presentation by going through many of the equipment and items bought with Strong Workforce and how they have helped expand the program - Matt Lee then presented for the Registered Nursing Program and mentioned that Chabot is currently ranked #3 for Best Nursing Schools in California - Matt then covered data on the program such as certificates offered and number of students currently in the program (29 currently and 40 anticipated for Fall 2024) - Matt then covered projects that CE supports including Skill/Simulation Lab Equipment and Maintenance as well as Pyxis machines which train healthcare students with
