3.1 Public Safety - Fire	Public Safety – Fire Technology	
Technology	 Bob started with background to the Fire Technology Program, mentioning that there are two degrees and three certificates of achievement: Associate of Science Degree – Fire Technology, Associate of Science Degree – Fire Prevention New Fire Technology Certificate of Achievement Bob mentioned more about the Fire Service Training opportunities and that training and testing are embedded into the Chabot Fire Academy as well as work experience and field internship training with Local Agency Fire Departments He then touched on their Advisory Board and how they have supported Local and Regional Projects Bob then touched on the Strong Workforce data and how Strong Workforce funding has supported many of their projects and the impact that has had He covered data on median annual earnings, number of students in the program and enrollment by race and ethnicity, credit course success rate, and a number of other data surrounding the program He also touched on academic support through administrative assistants and a Fire/EMS Lab Technican funded through Strong Workforce, as well as larger pieces of equipment and maintenance, and how vital it has been for the program, especially for Accreditation Bob ended with his ideas on how to increase enrollment, such as more marketing support, the need to replace remaining outdated equipment for operations, maintenance and supply costs as well as a few other methods
