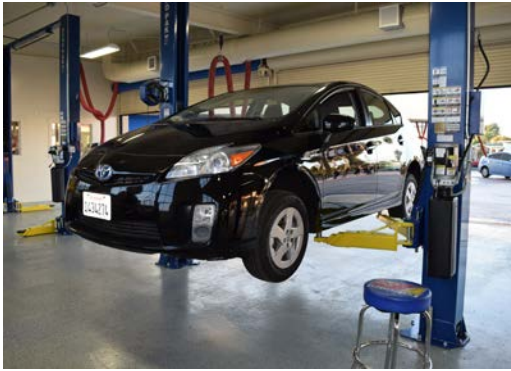

The Grant Development Office is pleased to announce the funding of 5 new awards to Chabot College since our Fall 2016 Update.

CA Energy Commission Grant

The Advanced Transportation and Renewable Energy (ATRE) Program – through funding from the California Energy Commission – released a competitive solicitation to fund enhancements to community college alternative fuel and vehicle technical training programs throughout California in August of 2016. ATRE received 16 proposals and Chabot was awarded 1 of 9 awards. Chabot's Automotive Technology Program, under the direction of Dean Kristin Lima and Kurt Shadbolt received \$184,826 to develop for-credit alternative fuel and vehicle technical training courses and programs with an emphasis on addressing regional workforce technical training needs for those who will be employed by fleets, dealerships, and independent shops.

CCCCO Industry-Driven Regional Collaborative

Also under the direction of Dean Kristin Lima, Chabot received the California Community Colleges Chancellor's Office Industry Driven Regional Collaborative Grant, supporting the work of the Automotive Technology Urban Area Consortium which includes 6 - S.F. Bay region and 4 - L.A. - Orange County Colleges. The award of \$154,350 will be distributed to the Colleges to update and enhance automotive technology curriculum in collaboration with Industry partners.

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Faculty Entrepreneurship Champion Mini-Grant

Miguel Colon, Chabot Entrepreneurship & Business Instructor, under Dean Kristin Lima's Applied Technology & Business Division, was invited by California Community College, Doing What Matters - for Jobs & Economy/Small Business Program, to submit a competitive proposal for Faculty Entrepreneurship Champion Mini-grant projects in October 2016 and was awarded \$7,500 to provide community college and high school faculty with scholarships to attend a 3-day Community College Entrepreneurship Pathway training to be held at Chabot in March of 2017. Additional funding in the amount of \$20,000 was received from the Southwest Bay Region Small Business Sector Initiative at Cabrillo College.



US Department of Education TRIO Talent Search Grant

Under the direction of Dean Jeanne Wilson, Chabot received 5 years of continuation funding from the U.S. Department of Education's TRIO Talent Search Program which identifies, motivates, and assists first generation college and low-income middle and high school students to persist through high school and enter college. The 5 year total award for these college readiness and tutoring services is \$1,420,800. The Program supports academic, financial, and career exploration; information about postsecondary education and college visits; completion of college admissions and financial aid applications; preparation for college entrance exams; and enrichment activities.
