Office of Institutional Research 2012-13 Accomplishments

This year, the Institutional Research Office focused on a few major projects, rather than trying to do the wide variety of research we were able to do with a larger staff. With our current staff of two very part-time student assistants, one very part-time programmer, and a full-time faculty Coordinator, we still completed almost 200 new programming requests or projects.

In addition, I responded to countless "just-in-time" requests for existing data or research from faculty, administrators, and classified professionals that came via email, phone, or various campus meetings. These requests sometimes became the seed of larger projects.

The major projects are outlined below, with links to many of the products. They fall into these groups:

Large research projects

1) Developed a way to measure progress on the strategic plan goal for PRBC

The Institutional Research Office is responsible for determining whether we are "increasing the number of students who achieve their educational goal in a reasonable time."

One number would not fairly represent all our students, because they have many different goals and take many different paths through Chabot. In order to accommodate those different goals and paths, I identified 10 distinct groups of students that pass through Chabot at different speeds, from different starting points, and towards different goals.

By looking at these "educational goal" groups separately, it allows us to identify which groups quickly achieve their goals and which groups need more time or support, so that a 'reasonable time' can be determined for each group. This mirrors what the students are actually doing at Chabot, rather than just what they say they want. Then interventions can be focused on the students who need the most support, rather than assuming that all students need assistance. In addition, equity by ethnicity and other characteristics can also be monitored.

Grant evaluation or development projects

A major portion of IR time goes towards evaluating and monitoring grants we have, as well as contributing research to developing grants. This year, IR time went to the following grants:

1) Title III Strengthening Institutions Grant and state Basic Skills funding

- Provided research to maintain eligibility for Title III and Title V grants
- Calculated success and persistence in Title III/Basic Skills-funded sections
- Conducted the Student Engagement Survey each semester in all funded sections

2) Hayward Promise Neighborhoods (HPN)

- Identified Chabot students from HPN neighborhoods and schools
- Provided past success and achievement data to set benchmarks for future cohorts

3) NIH Bridges to the Baccalaureate

Identified students in science and math courses for internship and UCB opportunities

4) CCAMPIS (Child Care Access Means Parents in School) Program

Provided persistence and completion data for Chabot students using Childcare Center

5) Math, Engineering, and Science Achievement (MESA)

Determined progress of cohorts of educationally disadvantaged students in STEM areas

6) Title V: Strengthening Institutions grant for Hispanic -Serving Institutions (HSI)

Provided educational goal group and equity group data to determine focus of grant.
