Athletes at Chabot College are much more likely to succeed and persist from semester to semester than students of the same gender or race-ethnicity who are not athletes. They are also more likely to plan to transfer to a 4-year college or earn an AA degree than non-athletes. Athletes are three percent of the students at Chabot, but they are four percent of the AA/AS degree graduates.
