**Income Levels:** Starting in Fall 2005, the following income definitions were used (examples at Fall 2013 levels)

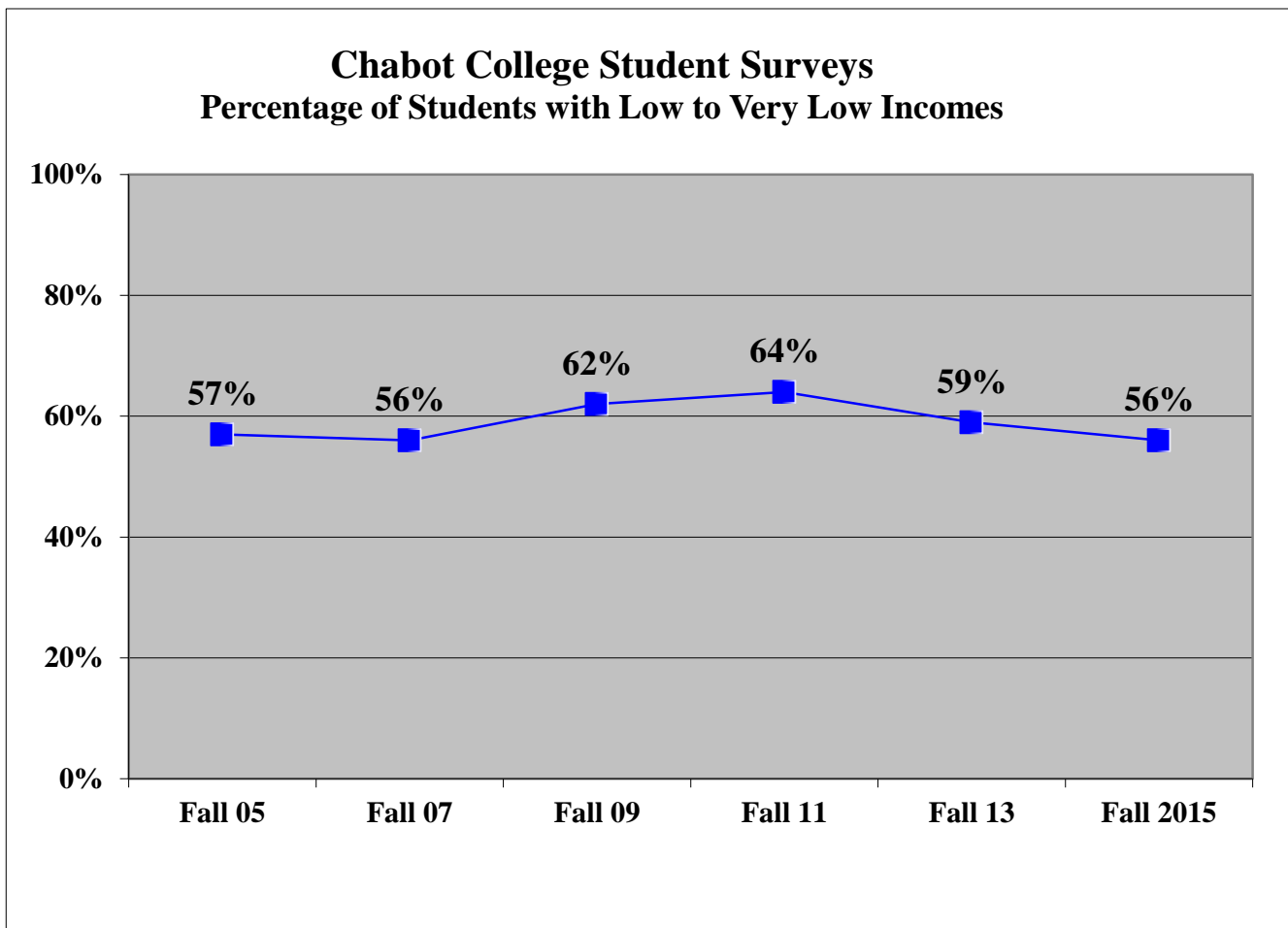
Very Low Income: 30 percent or less of local median income (Under \$35,000/yr for family of 4)

Low Income: 31-49% of local median income (\$35,000-\$50,000 for family of 4)

Low to Medium Income: 50-79% of local median income (50,000-\$65,000 for family of 4)

Medium Income: 80%-119% of local median income (\$65,000-\$105,000 for family of 4)

Medium to High Income: 120% or more of local median income (\$105,000 plus for family of 4)



**SOURCE NOTES:** The Chabot College Student Satisfaction Survey is conducted every other Fall. Surveys are conducted in a representative sample of on-campus course sections. Each percentage has a margin of error of one to three percentage points.
