Chabot College Two ways to describe our multi-racial, multi-ethnic student body

To describe the race-ethnicity of Chabot students, the federal reporting convention is to count Latinx students first. Then, all other groups are counted based on their racial group, or are put in Multi-Racial if they are in more than one group. However, if we count each race-ethnicity group first, we get a more accurate count of the non-Latinx groups. See below.
