
## Chabot College Summer Enrollments and Success Rates Summer 2014, Summer 2015, and Summer 2016

The surge in summer enrollments seen in Summer 2015 was sustained in Summer 2016. Enrollments in Summer 2016 topped those in Summer 2015 by almost 400.

Summers 2015 and 2016 offered the usual 6- and 8-week sessions, as well as two new 5-week sessions. Three-fifths of the sections were on campus and the rest were online/hybrid.

Overall success rates remained similar at 75-76 percent. Success rates were higher in the late 5-week, 6-week, and on-campus sessions.
