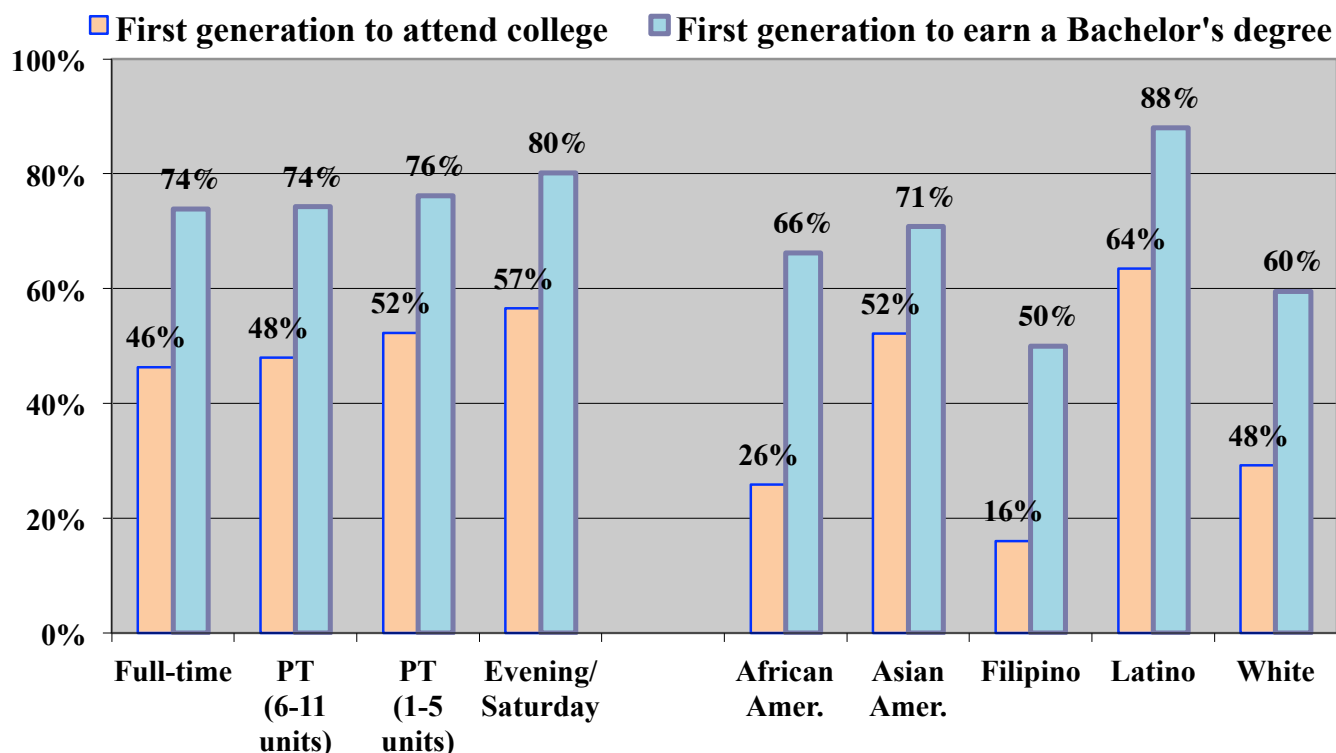
First Generation College Students (Parents' Education Level) By Full-time/Part-time/Evening Attendance and By Race-ethnicity

First generation college students are those whose parents either did not attend college, or they attended but did not earn a Bachelor's degree. For half of Chabot students, neither of their parents attended college, and for three quarters of the students, neither of their parents earned a Bachelor's degree. Latino and Evening/Saturday students are most likely to be first generation.

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SOURCE NOTES: The Chabot College Student Satisfaction Survey is conducted every other Fall in a representative sample of on-campus course sections. The Fall 2017 survey was conducted in October 2017 in a sample of 77 sections and was completed by 1,702 students (59% full-time and 41% part-time). Each percentage has a margin of error of 3 to 9 percentage points, depending on the group.
