The 17 peer colleges at the time of this report were: Contra Costa, Los Angeles Pierce, West LA, Sacramento City, Evergreen Valley, Mt San Antonio, Mira Costa, Pasadena, Cypress, Solano, Los Angeles Harbor, Skyline, Citrus, San Diego City, San Jose City, El Camino, and Napa.

Peer groups were established based on Fall 2016 and Scorecard 2017 data.

Peer group outcomes were based on Fall 2016 and 2015-16 outcomes.

**Setting aspirational goals:**

These decision rules for setting aspirational goals were approved by PRBC on March 16, 2016:

If Chabot is below average among peer group colleges, goal is to be at the average/median.

If Chabot is at the average among peer group colleges, goal is to be in top third.
