Chabot College Degree and Certificate Graduates Workforce Trends from 2009 to 2015, by Degree or Certificate Award

Summary

Of Chabot 2014-15 AA/AS degree graduates, about half were planning to transfer to a four-year college or university, and about half were planning to work, according to the Spring 2015 Graduate Survey. These percentages have held steady since 2009.

Of Chabot 2014-15 certificate graduates, 63 percent were planning to work, and only eight percent were planning to transfer. The percentage who already had a job increased dramatically from 9 percent in 2009 to 38 percent in 2015. In 2015, certificate graduates were most likely to use the certificate in a new job in the same career; whereas in 2009, certificate graduates were most likely to use it in a new career.

The Graduate Survey is given every other year to degree and certificate graduates who attend the Spring graduation ceremony. About one third of the graduates attend, and three quarters of those attending fill out a survey. Therefore, the survey results are more representative of those attending graduation than of all graduates. However, they give us a glimpse of the immediate plans of these successful graduates.
