

## Chabot College Athletes and Non-Athletes Fall 2017

Athletes at Chabot College are much more likely to succeed and persist from semester to semester than students of the same gender or race-ethnicity who are not athletes. They are also more likely to have a transfer or degree educational goal and have higher GPA or success rates than non-athletes. Athletes are two percent of the students at Chabot, but they earned four percent of the degrees.
