

President's Goals & College Planning Priorities: 2023 - 2024

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Introduction

Over the past year, we have experienced many successes for our students and our college:

- Successful accreditation
- Balanced budget
- The California Early Childhood Mentor Program, funded by the California Department of Social Services (4 new pathway pilots to support students majoring in early childhood development- 3 years for \$1million per year)
- Graduation and transfer rates
- Completion in 2023- we awarded over 1500 degrees and over 140 certificates
- Program rankings for top 10 programs
- Winning sports teams

We have been working hard and our success and achievements are shining, and Chabot is thriving. It is the power of US that helped us achieve these accomplishments.

Then there are the challenges. I believe that we talk about these not as weaknesses but as development areas. There have been a few items that stood out to me from over the past year that need to be addressed during the next few years. Just a few examples:

- Moving to an online Bookstore
- Strengthening the Chabot presence as a Hispanic Serving Institution (HSI)
- Implementing AB 1705 regulations
- Reorganization/Realignment

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As we move forward, we have to understand that we will have some trials and tribulations. There will be times when we may not all agree and when people will have strong opinions. However, through clear communication, a belief that we are starting the conversations from a place of positivity, support of one another, and spending time to find solutions that allow a win, win, win situation, we will be able to move past these issues.
