4. Applicants must have a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.7 or better. (Please check GPA eligibility for each scholarship.)
5. If you are planning to transfer to a four-year college, you need to submit a letter of acceptance by **Monday, August 3, 2009**, to the Office of Student Life. **All transfers must occur by Fall 2009!**
6. Applicants must authorize the Office of Student Life to request student transcripts from Admission & Records by checking the appropriate box on the application.
7. Each award has an attached nomination form that must be completed.
8. Each scholarship has a set of questions applicants must answer in essay form. All essays must be authentic, typewritten, double-spaced, 12-point font and must not exceed 2 pages in length.  
**Handwritten essays are unacceptable and will disqualify applicants.**
9. All completed applications must be submitted by **Wednesday, April 1, 2009, at 3:00 P.M., to the Office of Student Life, Room 2355.**

- have completed a minimum of 12 semester units (effective end of Fall 2008) at Chabot College and be currently enrolled in a minimum of 6 units at Chabot.
- have earned a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.7 or better (exception is Classified Senate Scholarship).
- ***prepare a separate essay for each scholarship.*** Each scholarship may have a different set of questions. All essays must be authentic, typewritten, no larger than a 12-point font, double-spaced, and must not exceed two pages in length. **Handwritten essays are unacceptable and will disqualify applicants.**

All completed applications must be submitted by **Wed. April 1, 2009, at 3:00 P.M., Room 2355.**

**Winners will receive their scholarships and awards at the  
Chabot Scholarships & Awards Reception Friday, May 8, 2009, 6:00 P.M. at the  
Chabot College Student Center Cafeteria.**
