Assessment of College-wide Learning Goals Global and Cultural Involvement

The majority of Chabot students —66% —are proficient or mostly proficient in global/cultural involvement, according to faculty who assessed these student learning outcomes in their general education courses in Fall 2014. They found that 87 percent were partially proficient or higher. This is similar to how Chabot graduates rated themselves. Assessment by faculty is the direct way to assess student learning—only faculty can tell how much students learn. An indirect way to assess is to ask the students themselves. Of students surveyed in the all-student Fall 2013 survey, 36% thought they were making a lot of progress in the global/cultural area; 77% said they were making some or a lot of progress. Of graduates at Spring 2015 graduation, 53% said they had learned a lot; 87% had learned some or a lot.
