 Accountability Reporting for the Community Colleges (ARCC)

 Annual evaluation of community college performance

 Measuring statewide educational outcome priorities

o Initiated by AB 1417

 Required the CCC System Office to develop an accountability report/model

o Report goes to the State Legislature

o Yearly Timeline

- November-December 2007 data checking
- January 2008 draft released to colleges
- February 2008 college self-assessment due
- March 2008 final report issued
- By March 2009 local Board of Trustee interaction with report
 (Feb 3, 2009 for CLPCCD)

• Report at two levels:

- Systemwide (7 measures)
- College (7 measures; we have data on 5)






<u>Systemwide Measures</u> Annual CCC Transfers to CSU



<u>Systemwide Measures</u> Annual CCC Transfers to UC




Increase in Personal Income After Graduating from a CCC in 2000-01

Methodology of College Reports

- College measures
- Peer groups
- Self-Assessment



*No Data will be presented



- For each college outcome, college peer groups were developed to provide context
- Peer groups were identified statistically based on similar college or local characteristics
- These characteristics influence the outcome and are outside the college's control
- Benchmarking within peer groups/not diagnostic within college (shows what not why)
- Colleges are not ranked

Peer Groups

• For example:

- Basic Skills Success rates were affected by:
 Percent of adults with bachelor's degree
 Poverty rate in local population
- Different characteristics and peer groups for each of 5 outcomes
- Chabot and Las Positas were usually in different peer groups

College Self-Assessment

- Each college composed a 1-page analysis of their performance
- Analyzed status within peer groups
- Identified college activities and local factors that could impact the numbers





Chabot Peer Groups Percent of Students who Earn at Least 30 Units








Chabot College Pre-Collegiate Improvement: Course Success Rate for Basic Skills



Las Positas College Peer Groups Percent of Students who Earned at Least 30 Units



Las Positas College Peer Groups Fall to Fall Persistence Rate



Las Positas College Peer Groups Vocational Course Success Rate




Las Positas College Pre-Collegiate Improvement: Course Success Rate for Basic Skills
