
Chabot College Student Educational Goal Groups Focus on Laser (FT) Not Assessed and Seeker (PT) Not Assessed Students


Our Strategic Plan goal is:

To answer these questions, we identified ten unique groups of students and are following their progress towards their goals. Each group has a different educational goal, pace of progress (units) and starting place (English assessment).

This page is about *Laser (FT) and Seeker (PT) Not Assessed* students. They have transfer/degree educational goals, but they did not take the English Assessment test. This means that they have to start in Basic Skills English, which should make them similar to *Laser* and *Seeker Basic Skills students*. However, they seem quite different. They are older, most were not in Early Decision, and few assessed into College Math. If they were Lasers (FT), they were more likely than their counterparts to complete English 1A; if they were Seekers (PT), they were less likely. Why the diffs?
