Which student groups contributed the most to this increase?


Latino students contributed the most degrees —they earned 61 more degrees, or 23% more.

Filipino students contributed the highest percentage rise - they earned 38, or 59% more degrees.

African American and Dreamer students contributed with an increase of 20% and 15% respectively.

Asians contributed 39 degrees to the increase, an above-average increase of 32%.

White students decreased their number of degrees—they lost 12 degrees, a 9% decrease.
