

## Survey of Spring 2015 Degree and Certificate Graduates

Half of the 2014-2015 degree and certificate graduates completed their program within three years; the other half took four or more years, according to the Spring 2015 Graduation Survey. The majority persevered to graduation by attending every term and attending mostly full-time, whether or not they were working. About half of these graduates planned to work in Fall 2015, and forty-six percent planned to transfer to a 4-year college.

The bienniel Graduation Survey was given to 2014-15 degree and certificate graduates who attended the graduation ceremony in May 2015. It was filled out by 75 percent of the 320 attendees or 26 percent of all 912 2014-15 graduates, so it is more representative of those who attended graduation than of all graduates. However, it gives us a glimpse of the completion time, attendance patterns, and immediate plans of successful graduates.
