
Latino Students at Chabot College: Success and Persistence

These tables show the latest course success and persistence rates of Latino students at Chabot by gender, age, student type, and educational goal. Latino students have similar success and persistence rates as all Chabot students. Among Latino students, success rates are the highest among older students, new transfer and continuing students, and those with job training goals. Persistence rates are highest among women and men 19 or younger, new and continuing students, and those with transfer goals.
