Frequently Asked Questions About CSU General Education and Transfer

What is CSU General Education? A pattern of courses that community college students can use to complete the lower-division (freshman and sophomore) general education (GE) requirements for any California State University (CSU) campus.

How should I prepare to transfer?

- ⇒ Explore majors and careers aligned with your motivations for attending college.
- ⇒ Manage your time and schedule adequate hours to study outside of class.
- ⇒ Plan to study *two hours per week for each unit* enrolled (*example: 12 units = 24 hours study per week*)
- ⇒ Work for the best grades possible. Earning a higher transfer GPA gives you more options.

What classes should I take for transfer to CSU?

- ⇒ Early on, complete the “Golden Four”: CSU GE Areas A1, A2, A3 and B4 (on back of this flyer).
- ⇒ Enroll in general education classes that interest you (on back of this flyer).
- ⇒ Complete lower division courses in your major. Very important for majors with many required courses.
- ⇒ Make an appointment with a counselor to write a Student Educational Plan (SEP).

How do I find the courses required for my major? To find lower-division courses major course requirements at CSU, go to the ASSIST website (www.assist.org) and/or complete an Associate Degree for Transfer (AS-T/AA-T) at Chabot College (see the Chabot College Catalog on the web). Consult with a counselor for more information.

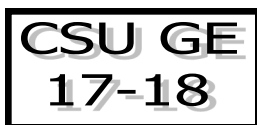
What else should I know about CSU GE? Area F is not required prior to transfer, only for CSU graduation. However, many students complete this requirement before transfer because the courses in Area F can also be used in Area D (“double counted”). Note: *each year* the CSU GE pattern is updated, so it’s important when selecting courses to look at the *current year’s* CSU GE pattern/flyer and/or the ASSIST website. Consult with a counselor for clarification.

How can I get more help with transfer? Make an appointment with a Chabot College counselor to develop a Student Educational Plan (SEP). Join a Chabot College Learning Community, First Year Experience (FYE), Special Program, and/or take a Psychology-Counseling (PSCN) course to learn skills for college success. Meet with transfer representatives & attend workshops in the Career Transfer Center. Attend Transfer Day. Visit/tour transfer schools.

Why should I have my CSU GE courses “certified” before I transfer? To avoid having to complete additional *lower division* general education courses after transfer. Students who complete CSU GE *need to request GE “certification”* from the Chabot College Admissions Office at the same time they request that a final transcript be sent to the *one* CSU campus where they have accepted an offer of admission. If CSU GE isn’t completed prior to transfer, partial certification of CSU GE is also available. Certification is automatic for students earning AA-T or AS-T degrees.
