### Frequently Asked Questions about IGETC

**What is IGETC?** A pattern of courses that community college students can use to complete the lower-division (freshman and sophomore) general education (GE) requirements for the California State University (CSU) and, in many instances, the University of California (UC).

**Is IGETC required for admission?** IGETC is NOT a part of the admissions requirements for CSU or UC, however, full completion of IGETC can be used as a *criteria for admission* for some campuses and majors.

**Who should use IGETC?** In general, students who plan to transfer but have not yet decided on a college or a major, as well as students who are **not** planning on pursuing "high unit majors" at UC. "High unit majors" are those with many courses required in the major (see next question). A few programs and majors at UC require IGETC for admission consideration. Consult with a counselor for details.

**When is IGETC not recommended?** Some majors and colleges at UC *do not* accept IGETC, and advise students to focus on completing courses in their *major* and *transfer eligibility requirements*. These "high unit majors" typically include engineering, life and physical sciences, pre-professional (pre-med, etc.) majors, and sometimes business. Also, students who enrolled at a UC campus and wish to return to the same UC campus, cannot use IGETC. Consult with a counselor for clarification.

**How do I find the UC transfer eligibility requirements and the courses required for my major?** For courses meeting the UC transfer eligibility requirements and lower division major course requirements at individual UC and CSU campuses, go to the website ASSIST ([www.assist.org](http://www.assist.org)). Consult with a counselor for clarification.

**What else should I know about IGETC?** All courses must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher. The *Oral Communication* requirement is needed for CSU admission, AA-T, and AS-T degrees only (not for UC admission). The *U.S. History, Constitution and American Ideals* requirement is required for CSU graduation only (not admission). Note: *each year* the IGETC pattern is updated, so it's important when selecting courses to look at the **current year's** IGETC pattern/flyer and/or the ASSIST website. Consult with a counselor for clarification.

**How can I get more help with transfer?** Make an appointment with a Chabot College counselor to develop a Student Educational Plan (SEP). Join a Chabot College Learning Community, First Year Experience (FYE), Special Program, and/or take a Psychology-Counseling course to learn skills for college success. Meet with transfer representatives and attend workshops in the Career Transfer Center. Attend Transfer Day. Visit transfer schools.

**Why should I have my IGETC courses "certified" before I transfer?** To avoid having to complete any additional lower division general education courses after transfer. Students who complete IGETC need to request IGETC "certification" from the Chabot College Admissions Office at the same time they request that a "final transcript" be sent to the **one** UC or CSU campus where they have accepted an offer of admission.
