WHAT IS THE INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM?

The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) is a general education program which community college transfer students can use to fulfill lower-division general education requirements in either the CSU or UC system without the need, after transfer, to take additional lower-division general education courses.

The IGETC is **NOT** an admission requirement to the CSU or UC system. There is no connection between completion of the IGETC and eligibility for admission to the CSU or UC system, or admission to a specific campus or program. Existing segmental and campus-specific admission requirements for transfer students remain unchanged. Requirements for lower-division courses for admission to particular majors also remain unchanged.

It is **NOT** advisable *for all* transfer students to follow the IGETC. Some students may be better served by taking courses which fulfill the CSU General Education-Breadth requirements or those of the UC campus or college to which they plan to transfer. Students pursuing majors that require extensive lower-division major preparation, such as Engineering on all campuses or Business at University of California, Berkeley, may not find the IGETC option to be advantageous. The IGETC will probably be most useful for students who want to keep their options open before making a final decision about transferring to a particular CSU or UC campus.

All coursework applicable to the IGETC **must be completed in its entirety prior to transfer and certified** in order to be accepted by CSU or UC. In addition to the course requirements for each subject area, full certification for the CSU must include completion of the Oral Communication requirement. For the UC, Oral Communication is not required, but the certification must include satisfactory completion of the foreign language proficiency requirement.

Courses taken at several institutions may be used to fulfill the IGETC. Students should be aware, however, that placement of courses within IGETC subject areas may vary from college to college. Placement of a course will be based on the college of attendance and its IGETC pattern, at the time the course was completed. Completion of the IGETC program will be **certified by the last community college which the student attends**.

HOW DO I COMPLETE THE INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CURRICULUM ?

The course requirements for all areas must be completed before the IGETC can be certified by Chabot College. All courses must be completed with minimum grades of "C" or "CR" or better. Lower Division preparation for an individual major also needs to be completed. Use a course in ONLY ONE AREA for certification.

AREA 1 - ENGLISH COMMUNICATION

CSU certification requires 3 courses - one from each group below (Group A, B, and C). UC certification requires 2 courses - one from group A and one from group B.

Group A: English Composition (1 course, 3 sem/4-5 qtr units)
English 1A

Group B: Critical Thinking - English Composition
(1 course, 3 sem/4-5 qtr units)
Course must have English Composition as a prerequisite.
English 4 or English 7

Group C: Oral Communication
(CSU only: 1 course, 3 sem/4-5 qtr units)
Speech 1 or 46

AREA 2 - MATHEMATICAL CONCEPTS AND QUANTITATIVE REASONING

(1 course, 3 sem/4-5 qtr units)
Math 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 8, 26, 33, 34, 42A, 42B

AREA 3-ARTS AND HUMANITIES (At least 3 courses, 9 sem/12-15 qtr units. At least one course must be from the ARTS area and one course must be from the HUMANITIES area.)

(At least 3 courses, 9 sem/12-15 qtr units. Courses MUST be completed from at least TWO disciplines or from an Interdisciplinary Sequence.)

(At least 2 courses, 7-9 sem/9-12 qtr units. One Physical Science course and one Biological Science course; at least one must include a laboratory. Underlined courses have labs.)

*Transfer credit maybe limited by UC or CSU or both.

LANGUAGE OTHER THAN ENGLISH (UC REQUIREMENT ONLY)

(Students shall demonstrate proficiency in a language other than English equal to 2 years of high school study in the same language. This requirement may also be satisfied by demonstration of equivalent proficiency prior to transfer.)

Foreign Language 1B (French, German, Italian, Russian or Spanish)

CSU GRADUATION REQUIREMENT - U.S. HISTORY, CONSTITUTION AND AMERICAN IDEALS (Not part of IGETC; may be completed at CSU).

Courses used for this requirement may NOT be used to satisfy any other area.

Complete one of the following combinations:

1. Political Science 1 (Chabot course) or 7 (LPC course) and History 8.
2. History 7 and 8 (Note: History 12, 20, 21, 22, 25 or 26 may be substituted for History 8.)
3. Political Science 1 (Chabot course) or 7 (LPC course) and one course from the following: Political Science 12, 20, 25, 30, 40 History 12, 20, 21, 22, 25, 26.

INTERSEGMENTAL GENERAL EDUCATION TRANSFER CERTIFICATION

If you are planning to transfer to any of the California State Universities or University of California campuses, you need to have your course work in the Intersegmental General Education Transfer curriculum certified by Chabot before you transfer. This is done at your request at the time you order your final transcript to be mailed directly to the UC or CSU before transferring.
