2. Discussion/Action Items 2.1 Presentation of Chabot data by consultant Robin Harrington	 Presentation of Chabot data by consultant Robin Harrington to inform the Comprehensive Local Needs Assessment being completed this year Robin started the presentation by going over the two requirements in Perkins for Core Indicators; one being negotiate yearly core indicator targets with the District and two, to complete a comprehensive local needs assessment. She then listed the Chancellor's Core Indicators as Postsecondary Retention & Placement, Earned Postsecondary Credential, Non-traditional Program Enrollment, Employment. She then went through each of the Core Indicators individually and explained how the Chancellor's office views the data. Robin then went through the data presented for each of the different programs and their Core Indicators. She mentioned that a few did not meet 90% of the state negotiated rate in that top code and explained what they need to look for and some next steps. Robin then went through a review of Core Indicator Special Programs (such as English Learners and Non-traditional and Single Parent) and explained the work she did to access the data, as well as explaining gaps around the data. Robin ended the presentation by going over a few of the resources she included. 	
3. Presentations 3.1 AMC Program Data Presentation 3.2 List of equipment requests to be voted on in February	 AMC Program Data Presentation Melissa Patterson presented on the Business program and started with mentioning some successes for the program such as adding further courses and increased HyFlex courses. She mentioned that they will also be adding night classes as an option for students again. She then went through data on Accounting and students who earned a Degree or Certificate. Melissa then talked through some of the difficulties the Business program faces such as not enough adjuncts to teach odd hour/place courses. She then concluded by mentioning some of the Improvements she hopes to see in the future including encouraging students to apply for financial aid, re-introduce degree review once an academic tear, consider non-credit course and continued funds to participate in conferences and other skill improvements for both full time and part time instructors. List of equipment requests to be voted on in February Christina pulled data from PAR requests and noted that there are several hundred thousand dollars to be able to fund requests in the Spring.
