College-going Rates of Local Public High School Graduates: Fall After Graduation All California, Alameda County, and Chabot College Area High Schools 1996-1997 to 2008-2009

These tables show the percentages of California public high school graduates who attended California public colleges– California community colleges, CSU, and UC–in the Fall after their graduation during the years of 1996-1997 to 2008-2009***. Compared to the previous year, in 2008-2009 the percentage of high school students enrolled in any community college in all of California and in Alameda County remained the same. However, there was a three percentage point increase among the graduates of Chabot's major local high schools who attended any community college to 37 percent. The percentage of local high school graduates who enrolled at Chabot also increased by two percentage points to 30 percent.

Since 1996-1997, the overall state percentage of high school graduates enrolling at a CSU has slowly increased to 13 percent, and the percentage enrolling at a UC has been stable at seven to eight percent. Graduates from Chabot high schools, who traditionally have higher enrollment rates into CSU than the state and county, decreased their enrollments to CSU in 2008-2009 by three percentage points to 18 percent. These students also decreased their enrollment to UC by one percentage points to 10 percent, which is above the state rate, but below the county rate. Aside from a small percentage who chose private or out-of-state colleges, only one third of local high school graduates did not attend college in the Fall after graduation. In Alameda County and California overall almost half did not attend college.
