

## Chabot College Student Characteristics Fall 2021

### Veterans vs. Non-Veterans

In Fall 2021, 284 veterans attended Chabot and made up two and a half percent of the student body. Many veterans at Chabot are male and older in age. Like most Chabot students, fifty-five percent of veterans are continuing students; forty percent have earned less than 30 units. About thirty-six percent are full-time; forty-one percent attended only during the day. Thirty-six percent of veterans intend to transfer to a four-year college, while thirty-seven percent are pursuing occupational certificates or job training.
