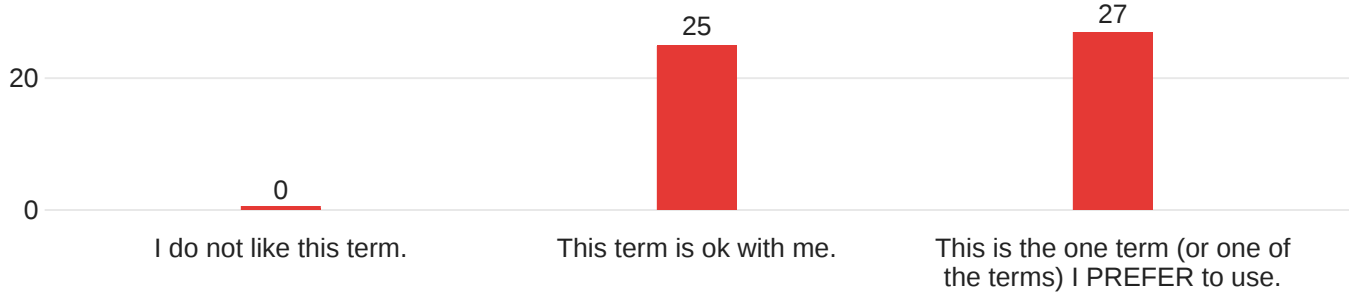

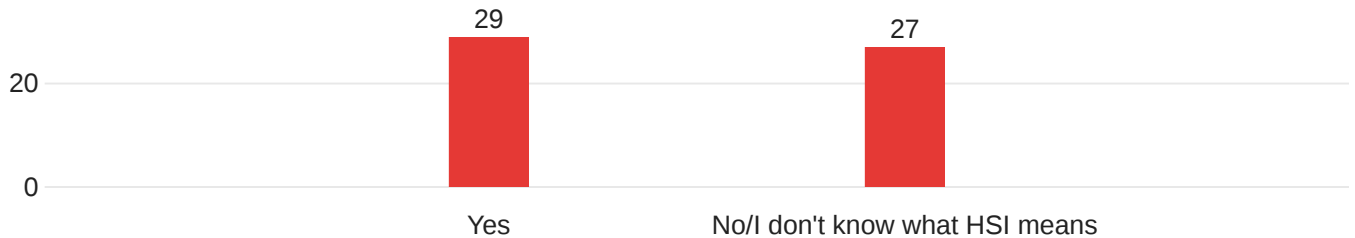

This program gave me confidence to begin my education at Chabot because the first two courses of the ECD Spanish cohort are taught in Spanish and the two next courses are Bilingual. After these four courses, students can transition to courses taught in English. This program permits ESL (Spanish speakers) students to take major courses while improving their English skills. I think it would be amazing to offer more opportunities like this in other fields. Why only the ECD can be an opportunity to pursue higher education for Hispanic people while there are other careers and professions. Hispanics have more to offer and to be part of, we just need a little more support.
