


Response Rate

- Survey was sent to all fall students who applied and/or were registered for Fall 2021 by the second week of August. (n=8,302)
- Good response rate!
 - Fall Enrollees at time of Survey: 8,302
 - Fall Respondents: ~1,150
 - Response Rate for Fall Enrollees: ~14%
- Potential Survey Bias
 - Electronic survey. Students with access to technology.
 - Students with strong opinions on Covid-19 in either direction.






• Over-representation of female students in survey respondents








- Over-representation of Asian American/Asian students in survey respondents
- Potential under-representation of Chicanx/Latinx/Hispanic students in survey respondents
- Note: Students who check off more than one race/ethnicity are counted in every group they check off.








• Over-representation of youngest students (19 or younger) in survey respondents



Vaccination Status: Majority of respondents are vaccinated




- **82%** of Fall 2021 Chabot student *respondents* are already full vaccinated.
- 91% of Fall 2021 Chabot student *respondents* are: 1) fully vaccinated *or* 2) partially vaccinated *or* 3) plan to get the vaccine.



Vaccination Status by Race/Ethnicity




• Asian American/Asian and Filipinx student respondents are more likely to be fully vaccinated.



Student Opinions on Vaccine Mandates for Students




- 72% of student respondents believe there should be a vaccine mandate for students (52% definitely yes, 20% probably yes).
- *Note: Students were asked: "Starting in Spring 2022, should Chabot require students to be fully vaccinated for Covid-19 in order to attend on-campus classes?"



Vaccination Mandates by Race/Ethnicity



• Asian American/Asian and Filipinx student respondents are most likely to want a vaccine mandate for students.




Willingness to Come to Campus if **Student** Vaccines are NOT Required



- **Just under half (46%)** of student respondents are *not willing to come to campus* if student vaccines are not required (22% definitely not; 24% probably not).
- Another 23% of student respondents are neutral/unsure whether they are willing to come to campus of


student vaccines are not required.



Variations by Race/Ethnicity for Willingness to Come to Campus if **Student** Vaccines are NOT Required



• If Chabot does NOT require a **student** vaccine: Native American (50%) and White (46%) respondents are *more* willing to come to campus and Asian American/Asian (22%) and Filipinx (21%) respondents are *less* willing.




Willingness to Come to Campus if **Employee** Vaccines are NOT Required



- Over half (54%) of student respondents are *not willing to come to campus* if employee vaccines are not required (27% definitely not; 27% probably not).
- Another 19% of student respondents *are neutral/unsure* whether they are willing to come to campus if employee


vaccines are not required.



Variations by Race/Ethnicity for Willingness to Come to Campus if **Employee** Vaccines are NOT Required



• If Chabot does NOT require an **employee** vaccine: Native American (38%) and White (38%) respondents are *more* willing to come to campus and Filipinx (17%) and Asian American/Asian (16%) respondents are *less* willing.



Reasons for Not Wanting Vaccination for Covid-19



- Seventy-five students said they did not plan to get the Covid-19 vaccine.
- Thirty-seven are undecided.
- "What are your main reasons for choosing "undecided" or "do not plan to get vaccinated"? (Check all that apply.)"
- Top Three Reasons:
 - 1) I am concerned about the vaccine's safety. (n=62)
 - 2) I am concerned about the vaccine's side effects. (n=60)
 - 3) I do not trust the information about the vaccine. (n=56)





- 82% of Fall 2021 Chabot student *respondents* are already full vaccinated.
- 91% of Fall 2021 Chabot student *respondents* are: 1) fully vaccinated *or* 2) partially vaccinated *or* 3) plan to get the vaccine.
 - Asian American/Asian and Filipinx student respondents are more likely to be fully vaccinated than students from other racial/ethnic backgrounds.
- 72% of student respondents believe there should be a vaccine mandate for students (52% definitely yes, 20% probably yes).
 - **Asian American/Asian** and **Filipinx** student respondents are most likely to want a vaccine mandate for students.





- **Just under half** of student respondents are *not willing to come to campus* if **student** vaccines are not required (22% definitely not; 24% probably not).
