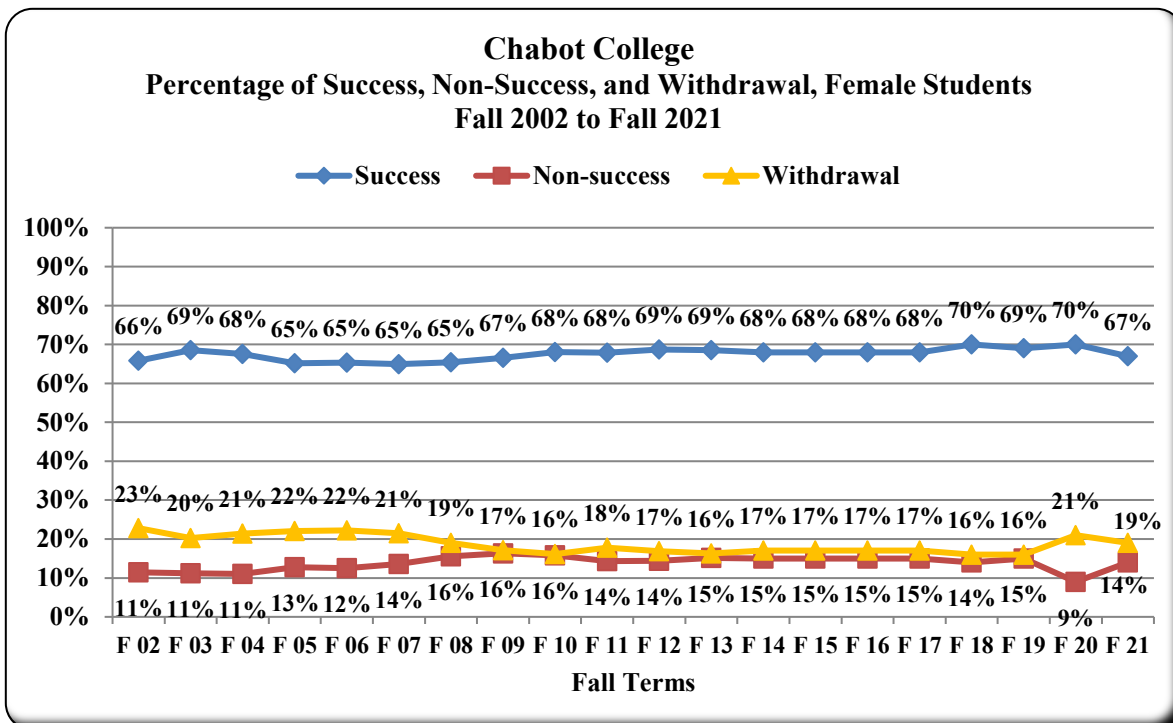


# Chabot College

## Course Success and Withdrawal rates, by Course Enrollments and Students Fall 2002 to Fall 2021 Female Students

Chabot female students' course success rates have remained stable at 68-70 percent in the past eleven years, it fell to 67% in Fall 2021. Withdrawal rates dropped from 21-24 percent in early 2000's to 16-17 percent in recent years, and rose to 19 percent in Fall 2021. Non-success rates (D, F, No Credit, No Pass, or Incomplete) had gone up slightly from an average of 12 percent during the early 2000's, down to 9 percent in Fall 2020, and up again to 14 percent in Fall 2021. The percentage of students who withdrew from all their courses fell from 12-14 percent in the early 2000's to 11-13 percent in recent years.

## Course Success and Withdrawal Rates, by Course Enrollments and Students

### Fall 2002 to Fall 2021

#### Male Students

In the last five years, male Chabot students had higher course success rates than anytime in the last 19 years. Course success rates, traditionally stable at 63-65 percent, rose to 69 percent in Fall 2011, then 70 percent in Fall 2021. Withdrawal rates, stable at 21-23 percent, rose to 19 percent in Fall 2020, and declined to 16 percent in Fall 2021. In addition, the percentage of students who withdrew from all their courses fell to 8-10 percent in the early 2010's, and to 10 percent in Fall 2021. However, non-success rates (D, F, No Credit, No Pass, or Incomplete) have gone up slightly from an average of 13 percent during the early 2000's, down to 9 percent in Fall 2020, and up again to 14 percent in Fall 2021. Compared to the early 2000s, male students are now more likely to stay enrolled in their classes, whether they are succeeding or not.
