Course Success and Withdrawal Rates, by Course Enrollments and Students Fall 2000 to Fall 2019

All Students

Chabot students' course success rates, traditionally stable at 65-68 percent, rose to 69 percent in Fall 2019. Withdrawal rates, stable at 22-23 percent, dropped to 16 percent in Fall 2019. Non-success rates (D, F, No Credit, No Pass, or Incomplete) have gone up slightly from an average of 12 percent during the early 2000's to 15 percent in Fall 2019. However, the percentage of students who withdrew from all their courses fell from 16 percent in the early 2000's to 9-10 percent in recent years. Compared to the early 2000s, students are now more likely to stay enrolled in their classes, whether they are succeeding or not.
