**Changes between 2016-2017 and 2017-2018**

The number of degrees awarded at Chabot College rose by 133, or 13% between 2016-17 and 2017-18.

**Which student groups contributed the most to this increase from 2016-17 to 2017-18?**

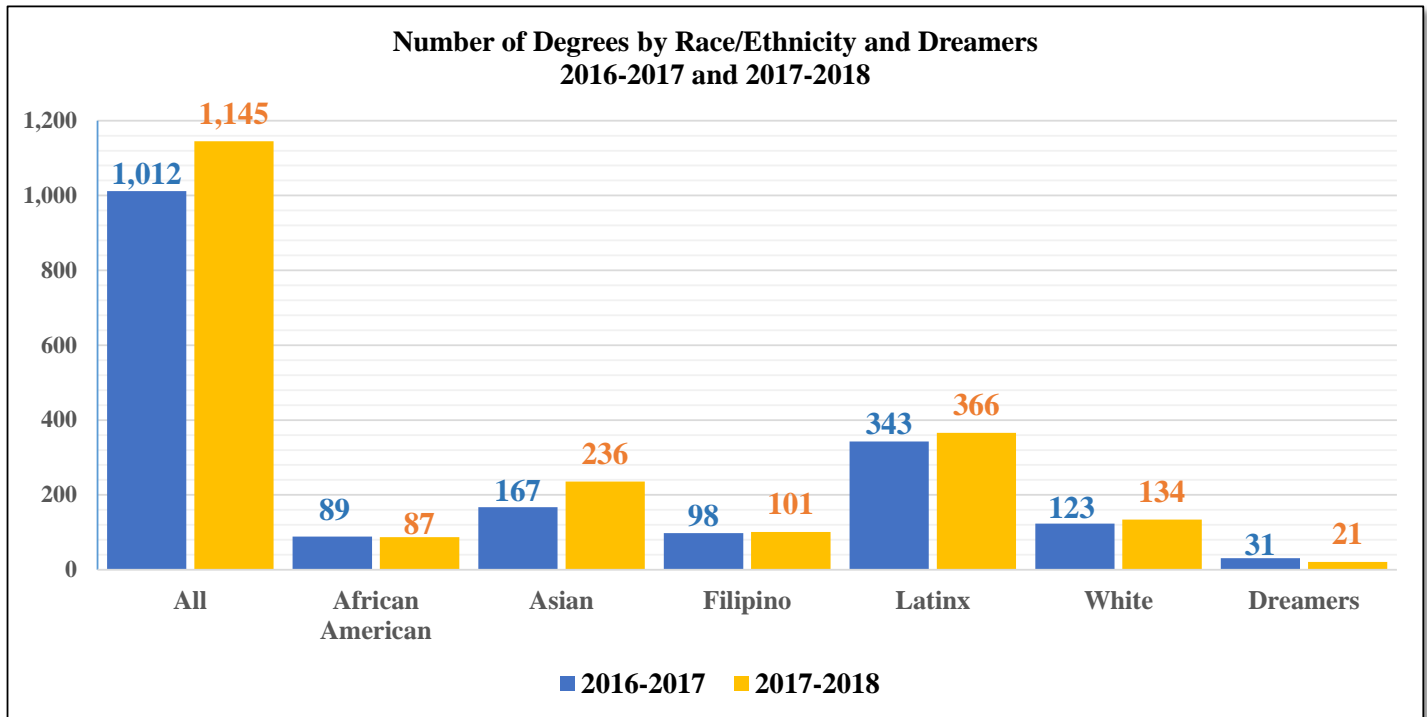
Latinx students contributed the most degrees: they earned 366 of the 1,145 degrees awarded in 2017-18.

Asian students contributed the highest percentage rise: they earned 41% (or 69) more degrees in 2017-18.

African students decreased their number of degrees slightly: with 2 fewer degrees in 2017-18, a 2% decrease.

Filipino students increased their number of degrees: they were awarded 3 more degrees in 2017-18, a 3% increase.

White students were awarded 11 more degrees in 2017-18, a 8% increase.
