Degrees by Major Race/Ethnicity Groups and Dreamers

Changes between 2017-2018 and 2018-2019

The number of degrees awarded at Chabot College rose by 162, or 14% between 2017-18 and 2018-19.

Which student groups contributed the most to this increase from 2017-18 to 2018-19?

Latinx students contributed the most degrees: they earned 494 of the 1,308 degrees awarded in 2018-19.

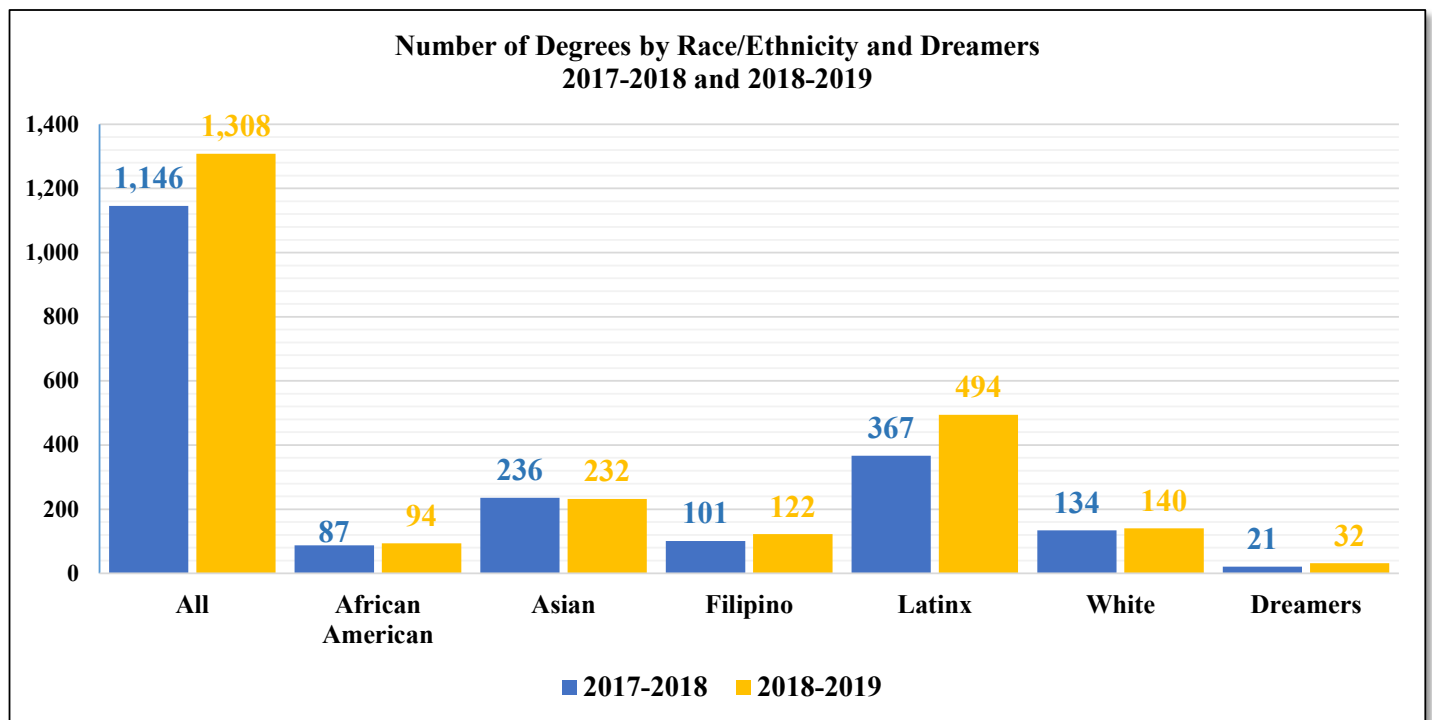
Latinx students contributed the highest percentage rise: they earned 35% (or 127) more degrees in 2018-19.

Asian students decreased their number of degrees slightly: with 4 fewer degrees in 2018-19, a 2% decrease.

African American students increased their number of degrees: with 7 more degrees in 2018-19, a 8% increase.

Filipino students were awarded 21 more degrees in 2018-19, a 21% increase.

White students were awarded 6 more degrees in 2018-19, a 4% increase.
